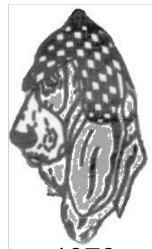

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE

From west mostly motorway. Take M62 and keep on until junction 32A exit onto A1(M) north at junction 42 take the A63 exit Leeds/Selby. AT roundabout take 4th exit onto A63 heading to A1M Selby. Go round 2 roundabouts. AT the roundabout take 1st exit onto Leeds Road A63 Venue is just a few yards on the right hand side.

OR

M62 keep on motorway and come off junction 32A—A19 road. Turn left onto A63 signposted Selby and follows signs for Thorpe Willoughby. M62 to junction 27 take slip road left M621 towards Leeds. At exit take slip road left A653 to Leeds/Holbeck/Beeston. Keep on A653 take slip road right for A64 York Road. Bear left and bear left onto A6120 Selby Road. AT roundabout take 2nd exit onto A63 Selby Road. Pass through 3 roundabouts remaining on A63. Keep on A63 for another 3 roundabouts. At roundabout take 1st exit onto Leeds Road.

FOR NORTH TAKE A1M SOUTH A1M JUNCTION 42 Take A63 3rd exit to Leeds/Selby. AT roundabout take 1st exit onto Leeds Road A63 Thorpe Willoughby Village Venue a few yards on right hand side.

SOFT CRATES.

The Kennel Club has asked that we draw attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. They have asked that we point out that dogs should not be left unattended in soft crates. There has been instances where dogs have escaped from soft crates which have not been securely fastened to benches, or that have been left at ringside. We therefore ask that if you use soft crates, you do not leave the dogs unattended, either in the hall or in an open car in the car park.

Please Note that puppies aged 4 calendar months and over can be entered not for competition at this show. (Handling class during lunch break)

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 10.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 11.00 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. The entry fee is Members £6.00, subsequent entries £1.00. Non Members £7.50, subsequent entries £1.50. Veteran Class. £3.00. Not for Competition £2.00.
7. There is no prize money on offer at this show
8. The Committee reserve to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under 6 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six months and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively.
Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from AV Classes when judged before Breed Classes. See proviso after Rule 12.
12. **BEST IN SHOW** The dog declared BEST in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best in Show must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from dogs beaten only by the dog declared Best in Show. Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all competition other than Breed Classes and Best of Breed prior to competition for Best in Show as appropriate to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from AV Classes when judged before Breed Classes.
PROVISO FOR RULES 11 & 12 For the purpose of these regulations, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered a beaten dog.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being competed on time, and then only with the permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except with permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertising by advertising in the canine press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. **Dogs in Cars on Hot Days**, your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at K.C. licensed events.
*When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. *If your vehicle in not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. *The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink. *Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air round your dog. *When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle. *Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade, for example a large umbrella, and always have plenty of water available so your dog stays well hydrated. *Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **Warning: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
18. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by an advertisement in the Canin Press wherever possible.
19. Not for Competition Entries will be accepted. Details of each dog must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. (Must be over 4 months of age).
20. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show with the licenced venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
21. The Officers and Committee of the show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by standholders at the show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club, which count towards the Title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class (i.e. 23-1-2012). Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options: - **Withdrawal** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

20. Transfer If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or the Junior class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of their being no Puppy or Junior class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY	For dogs of 6 months and not exceeding nine calendar months on the first day of the show.
PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
JUNIOR	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show
NOVICE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
POST GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship show in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.
LIMIT	For dogs which have not won three Challenge Certificates under three different judges or seven or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
OPEN	For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
VETERAN	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.
NOT FOR COMPETITION	For dogs or bitches of the breed that have not been entered in any other class at the show also in the case of puppies over the age of four months and under the age of six months that are not for exhibition

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition for any Kennel Club Licenced event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee whose decision shall be final and may include reference for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rule A42.
2. No substance, which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat, may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition either before or at the show. Any other substance (other than water), which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition, must not be allowed to remain in the coat of a dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation or dog or any part thereof may be performed and nothing may be done, calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive, except: -
 - a. Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
 - b. The removal of dewclaws of any breed the shortening of tails customarily docked
 - c. Operations to prevent breeding provided such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order the examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any object by an individual related to an infringement of the Regulations must be made in writing to the show secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
